Condominiums

- Condos are a type of living space similar to an apartment but independently sellable and therefore regarded as real estate. The condominium building structure is divided into several units that are each separately owned, surrounded by common areas that are jointly owned. With a condo you only own the interior of your property and no land is owned.
- A <u>Site Condominium</u> refers to a project of Single Family, totally detached dwellings encumbered by a declaration of condominium covenants or a condominium form of ownership. They have no shared garages or any other attached building. With the site condo you own the interior and exterior of the property along with the lot of land that the property sits on.
- A <u>townhome</u> is a tall, narrow, traditional row house, generally having three or more floors.
- With a townhome you own the interior, exterior and the footprint of land underneath the property.
